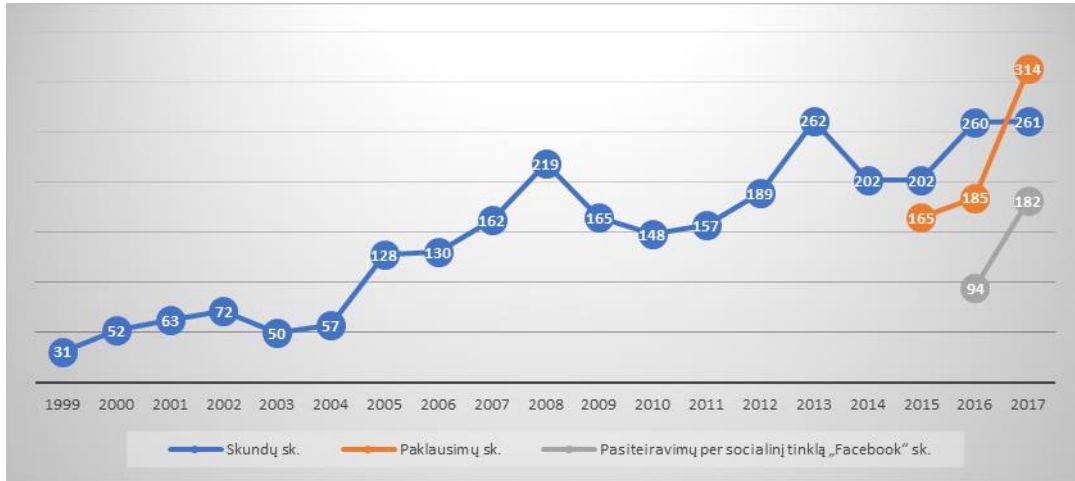

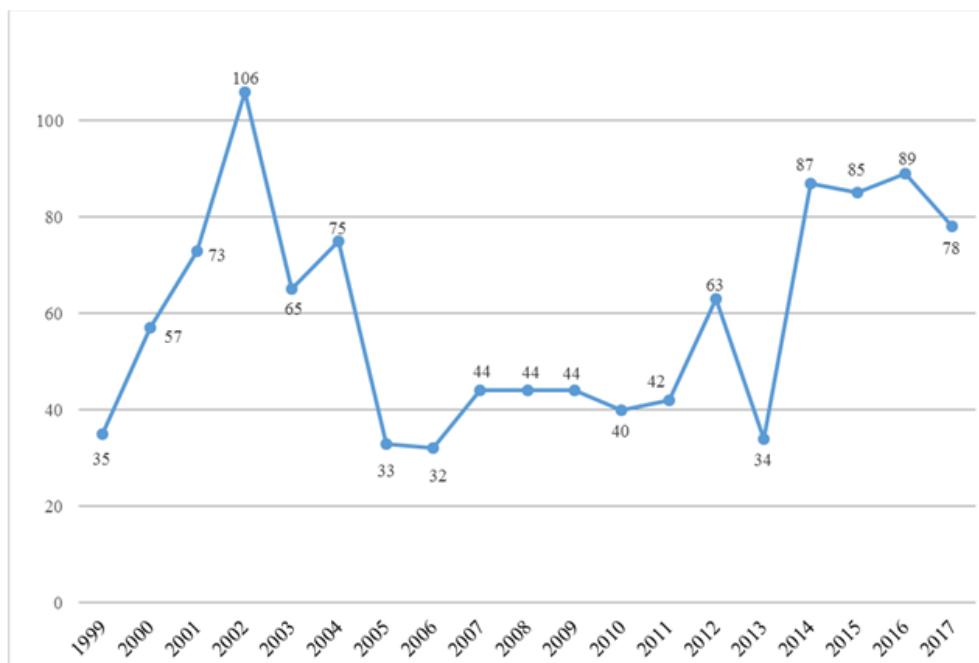
Number of applications to the Office of the Equal Opportunities Ombudsperson (complaints, questions, inquiries on Facebook)

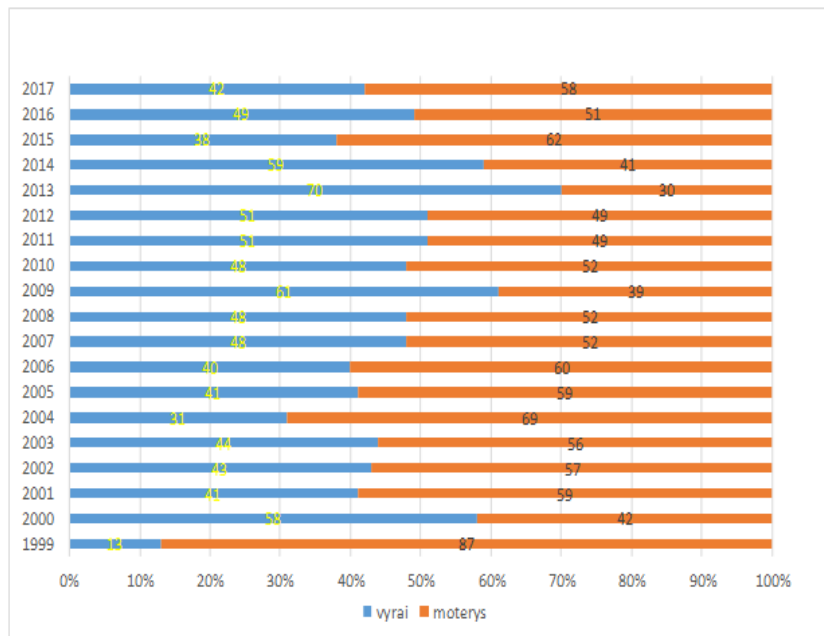
Number of investigations on possible gender-based discrimination

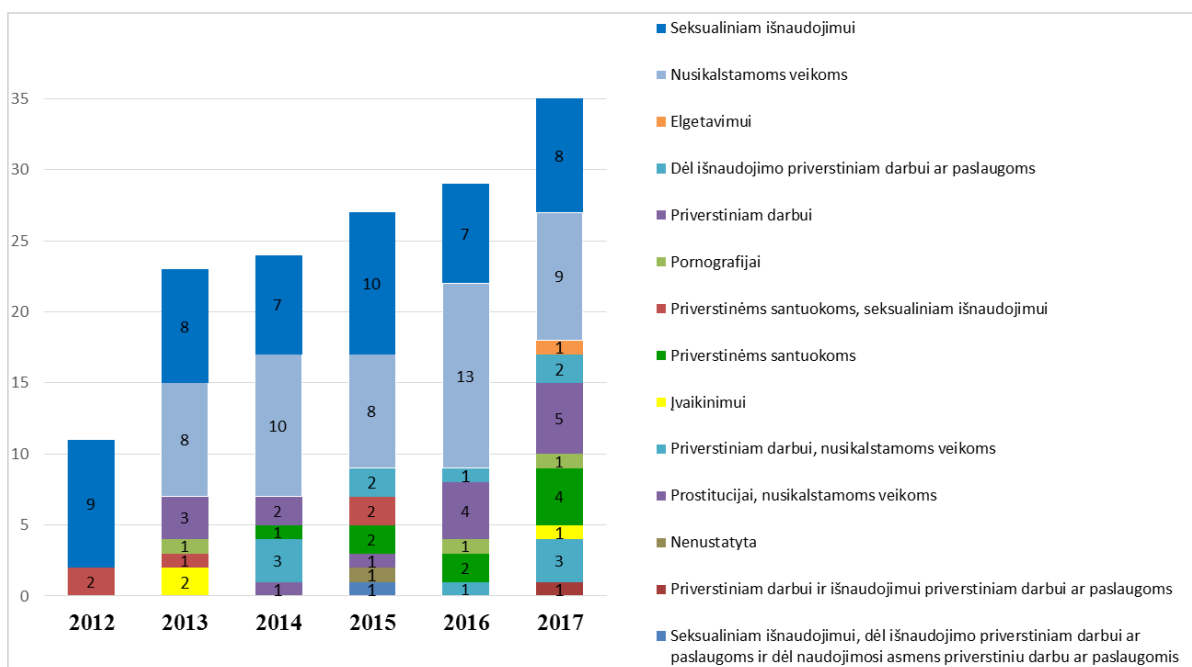

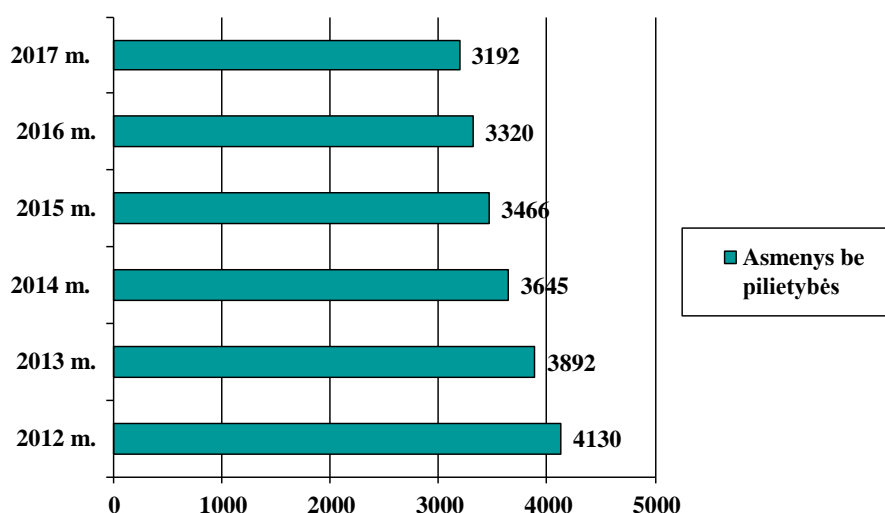

On 1 January 2016, a total of 3,466 stateless persons lived in the Republic of Lithuania, of which:

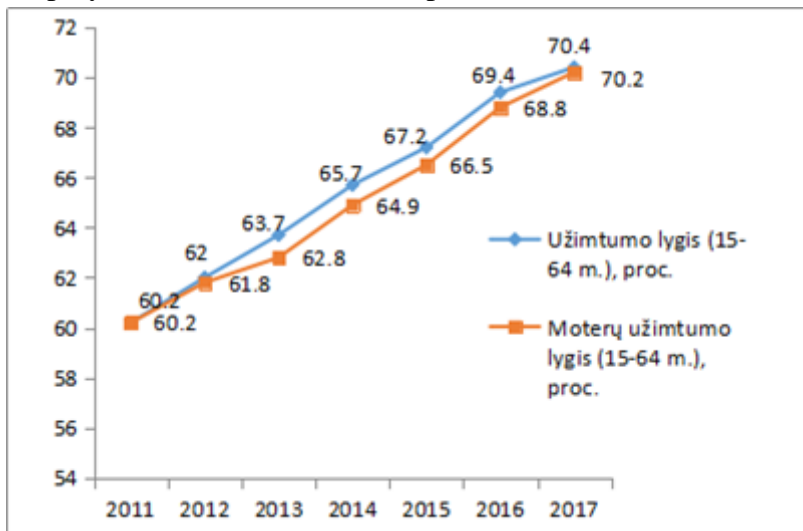
- 3,369 persons with a long-term residence permit of the Republic of Lithuania to reside in the EC;

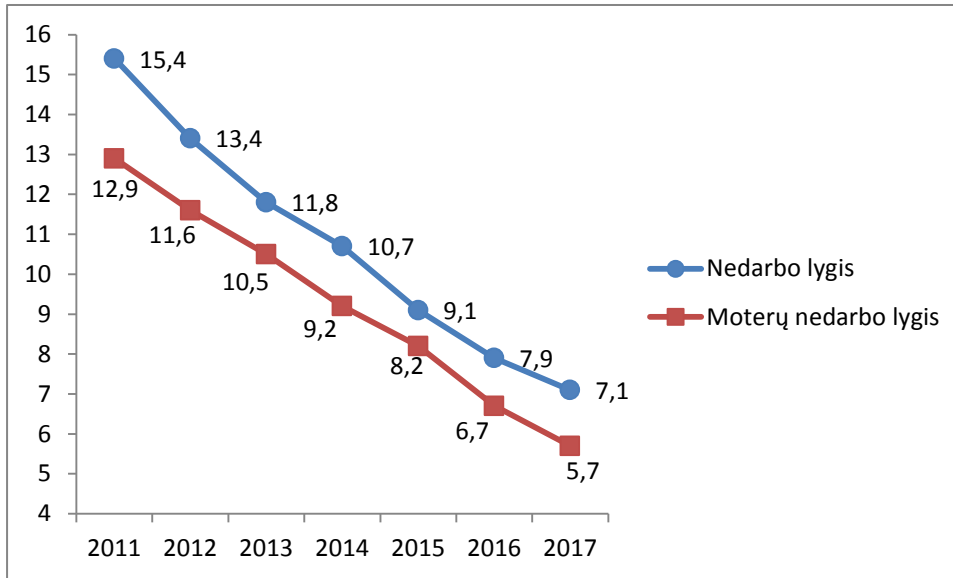
Employment rate: total, women (percent)
